HEALTH MINISTRIES BLOOD PRESSURE CLINIC/MINI HEALTH FAIR

March 14 from 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 - 12:30 p.m. - Narthex

Colorectal cancer is the third leading cause of cancer death among men and women in the United States and yet it is highly preventable. FREE colorectal cancer screening kits will be available on March 14. The American Cancer Society recommends adults aged 50 and older get tested for the disease. People with colon cancer in their families may need to start getting tested when they are younger. If colon cancer is found early, the survival rate is 90%. Yet only 39% of colon cancers are found at this early stage. Don't wait for signs or symptoms to go to the doctor – get tested today and prevent colon cancer before it starts. Pick up your colorectal screening kit, do the procedure at home, and mail it back to St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, Pontiac. St. Joe's will personally notify you of the results.

Have your blood pressure checked and pick up valuable information in the Narthex about "Cancer Awareness", as well as your FREE colorectal screening kit.
